In every case where emergency lights and siren are used, officers will exercise judgment and care with due regard for life and property when responding to an emergency call, or when in pursuit of a suspected or actual violator of the law, stated in the procedure 43.4 covering "vehicle pursuits" currently in effect. Officers will stop, or be able to stop, for all traffic control devices. Officers are cautioned that negligence in the operation of an emergency vehicle will result in disciplinary action, and may result in criminal and/or civil actions.

- 2. Marked Patrol Vehicles** – A majority of police vehicles used for routine patrol will be conspicuously marked and easily identified as a police vehicle.

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**3. Equipment** - All marked vehicles used for patrol purposes will be equipped with emergency lights and siren. Each vehicle will contain;

- a. Emergency flares
- b. Safety rope / water rescue device
- c. Breath Test Device
- d. Fire extinguisher
- e. Digital Camera



- g. spare tire
- h. jack and handle
